■ Have a satisfactory score (79 internet, 213 computer, 550 paper) on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).

■ Show proof of ability to cover expenses for at least one full year of study at Trinity.

■ Pursue a full-course of study (a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester). Failure to adhere to this requirement (USCIS regulations F-1 and J-1 visa categories) may jeopardize immigration status.

International Applicants must submit the following items:

■ Completed, signed, and dated application for admission.

■ Personal Statement.

■ One letter of recommendation from a high school teacher or guidance counselor.

■ \$40 non-refundable application fee payable in U.S dollars by money order or cashier's check made out to Trinity.

■ Certified educational documents or final secondary school records, university transcripts, mark sheets and course syllabi or catalogs. **All international applicants must submit official transcripts to the World Education Service (WES).** WES will translate and evaluate the transcripts and provide Trinity with the educational equivalence. For more information about WES, visit their website at www.wes.org.

■ Official results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) if a) English is not your native language, b) you are not a citizen of a country in which English is an official language, c) you have not earned a college/university degree in the U.S., or d) you are not currently enrolled in a degree program in the U.S.

■ Statement of Financial Resources form and supporting documentation indicating sources of income while attending Trinity.
