Interviews with students revealed the methods used for instruction in the NBCOT Exam Course needed to be revised. The NBCOT review course (OTA 294) was revised and will continue to be offered online to assist with successful completion of the exam. The course is taken during the last semester of the program while students are completing Level II fieldwork. Additionally, Trinity hosted an outside organization offering students the opportunity to participate in an NBCOT prep course after completing level II fieldwork. NBCOT exam pass rates will be monitored for effectiveness of the course and overall curriculum."
