Montgomery College (hereafter referred to as MC), a community college in Montgomery County, Maryland and Trinity Washington University (hereafter referred to as Trinity), a four-year institution in Washington, D.C., agree to offer an articulated program leading to the award of an Associate of Science in Nursing and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. MC students who transfer with an Associate of Science in Nursing to Trinity will not have their coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis to determine which of Trinity's general education requirements and discipline requirements have been met. MC course agreements outlined below ensure that the transfer student will matriculate at junior standing.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is to establish collaboration between Trinity and MC to facilitate the transfer and degree completion of students earning the Bachelor of Science in Nursing. This Agreement provides a systematic plan for students to continue their higher education beyond the A.S. degree from MC. The following general principles guide the operation of this Agreement:

II. ADMISSIONS

Applicants successfully completing the articulated program with a **2.5** or better grade point average with no grade below a C to transfer, who have not matriculated at any other institution of higher education and who hold current, active RN licensure in the District of Columbia, Maryland, or Virginia will be guaranteed transfer admission to Trinity.

III. ACCEPTANCE OF CREDITS

A maximum of 82 credit hours from MC will be allowed toward fulfillment of the 128 credit hours required for baccalaureate completion.

A. General Education Credits:

All courses meeting general education requirements at MC will transfer to Trinity as shown in Appendix A. Courses not specified will be reviewed on a course by course basis for equivalency.

B. Credits Accepted from Other Institutions:

If courses are evaluated by MC and applied toward the Associate of Science degree, the student must submit the score report to be evaluated by Trinity. Credit will be applied as determined by a Trinity. evaluation.

C. Non-Direct Classroom Credits:

The maximum number of credits that will be accepted by Trinity toward degree requirements from non-direct classroom instruction (including CLEP, Co-op Education, AP, and other nationally recognized standardized examination scores) is 30. Non-Direct Classroom credits earned through any combination of approved examinations or college-level experiential learning may be applied toward the completion of a Trinity degree. Any applied credits of this type must be in addition to the minimum 45 credits taken at Trinity (see <u>Undergraduate Student Transfer and Matriculation</u>). Credit satisfying major field requirements will be determined by the appropriate Program Chair(s).

Undergraduate Student Transfer and Matriculation: Students transferring to Trinity in or after Fall 2002 from another appropriately accredited institution of higher learning for a bachelor's degree must earn a minimum of 45 of their final 60 credits through course work at Trinity, excluding credits for experiential learning. Associations recognized by the United States Department of Education (USDE) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHEA) confer appropriate accreditation; these associations include but are not limited to regional accreditors.

IV. SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

MC students who have completed an Associate of Science in Nursing will be given every consideration for financial assistance and will be eligible to compete for need and non-need based academic scholarships at Trinity.

V. BENEFITS TO STUDENTS

Trinity offers the following benefits for MC students who transfer under this Agreement.

MC nursing graduates admitted to Trinity will benefit from a \$1000 tuition scholarship applied to the final semester registration for BSN courses. Trinity offers students an application fee waiver for those students who apply online. Upon acceptance to Trinity, MC nursing graduates will meet one-on-one with the Trinity nursing academic and faculty advisor to review her/his curriculum plan and register for courses.

VI. PROMOTION/OUTREACH

MC and Trinity agree to publicize this Agreement via, but not limited to marketing materials and information sessions. Trinity's logo and transfer pathway will be featured on MC's transfer agreements website. MC and Trinity agree to collaborate to ensure successful transfer day visits, and advising sessions.

VII. TERM/MONITOR/REVIEW

- A. The initial term of this agreement shall be two years from the date of the last signature, with three (3) automatic renewals of two years each.
- **B.** MC and Trinity further agree to monitor the performance of this Agreement biannually for the first year and biennially thereafter.
- C. Trinity will establish a mechanism to provide information on the academic progress of the MC student enrolled as a result of this Agreement, including but not limited to statistical data compiled from non-specific student information.
- **D.** MC and Trinity agree to communicate program changes in a timely manner to avoid disruption of student progress toward degree completion.

VIII. TERMINATION

The Agreement may be terminated by either party for due cause and after adequate notice to the other. Termination of the Agreement will not affect any students currently enrolled at MC in the name of major at the time of termination, and they shall be able to transfer credits pursuant to this Agreement.

IX. APPENDIX

As part of this agreement, the following have been included:

A. An academic advising sheet showing requirements for a completed associate of Science degree in Nursing at MC, additional pre-requisites to be completed at MC, and upper level courses required to obtain a BSN at Trinity.
